Course Descriptions

Guardian Angels

We will discuss the history of angels, the language of angels, and the role of angels in modern times. C.S. Lewis

One of the great thinkers of the 20th century as well as the author of *The Chronicles of Narnia* and friend to J.R.R. Tolkien, Clive Staples Lewis, or Jack as he was known, remains an intriguing figure. Come and learn about the man who went to Oxford, taught at Cambridge, and wrote books that continue to inspire, confuse, and amuse readers today!

“What Did You Do in the War, Dad?”

Follow one man's search for his father's WWII story. This presentation is the culmination of a 12-year personal journey. From my father's induction into the US Army just after Pearl Harbor through to the end of the War, the story is told through artifacts, period photographs taken by my father, and my matching “today” photos for a “then and now” comparison. Hildegard of Bingen

Born over 900 years ago, Hildegard is considered the first woman writer. She was also a composer, a playwright, an artist, a naturalist, and a mystic. Come and explore the life of this truly remarkable and fascinating woman.

Is there really a solar calendar hidden in the grid of D.C. streets? Is the one dollar bill as enigmatic as it has been suggested? Come and join us as we explore the Secrets of Washington, D.C.

Dreams and Their Meanings

This course covers the fascinating realm of dreams, their purpose, and meaning in our lives. We all dream whether or not we remember on waking. Come and learn how to remember your dreams, how to interpret and analyze your dreams, and how to keep and use a dream journal.

Wild Wise Women

Ghosts 101

Join us for a class that explores the paranormal. This course covers ghosts and hauntings. It includes an overview of the types of ghosts and the characteristics of an authentic haunting. We will also discuss modern tools used for investigating the ghostly realms and a demonstration of electronic voice phenomenon recorded at the instructor's former Gettysburg home.

Transcendentalism

This course is an introduction to the transcendental movement that included some of the great minds in American history. Transcendentalism was both a literary and philosophical movement that shaped American history with its idealism and which greatly influenced democratic abolitionist reforms as well as the writings of Melville, Hawthorne, and Whitman. The Fascinating Realm of Fairies
