Oral Communication Assessment

<u>Spring 2018</u>

Introduction:

In lieu of the standard assessment of Oral Communication skills through the collection of samples of student work, an assessment of course requirements was undertaken in order to provide a more accurate pool of courses from which to sample in future Oral Communication assessments. Previous Oral Communication assessments had suffered from overreliance on Communication courses as well as the inclusion of courses that did not have a standardized oral presentation requirement. Thus, the assessment aimed to identify courses offered college-wide that included an oral presentation requirement, with the goal of better assessing oral communication skills as presented by students in a variety of courses representing many college programs.

Method:

An online survey was developed using Qualtrics survey software. The survey first asked respondents if they taught a course with an oral presentation requirement. All remaining questions were determined by participants' responses to this and subsequent questions. Qualifying participants could be asked if the oral presentation requirement was in Communications courses, the name of the course(s) with oral presentation requirements, and how grading was determined in the course(s). Participants could report on up to three courses with oral presentation requirements.

The survey was distributed via email to all full-time and part-time faculty members. The email notified faculty members of the purpose of the survey, and that it was being conducted in place of the regularly scheduled oral communication general education assessment. Participants were also informed that the survey should take approximately five minutes to complete. Participants accessed the survey by clicking on a link in the email. The email notifications were sent out to faculty members within the first month of the Spring 2018 semester. A reminder email was sent about three weeks later. Data was downloaded and analyzed following the spring semester break, approximately a month following the reminder email.

Results:

Five-hundred faculty members completed the survey out of approximately 2,836 full-time and part-time faculty members, a 17.6% response rate. Of these 500 responses, 222 (44.4%) reported teaching a course with an oral presentation requirement. Of respondents teaching a course with an oral presentation requirement, 29 (5.8%) were reported as being a requirement only in Communications courses. The remainder of the survey asked respondents to report the names and grading requirements of courses that required an oral presentation.

One hundred and thirty individual courses were reported as requiring an oral presentation. Of these courses, 91 include oral presentations that are graded based upon presentation skills. Finally, 72 courses used a rubric to grade oral presentation skills.

The 72 courses using a rubric to grade oral presentation skills are shown in Table 1 below. Of these courses, FS 100 was reported by the largest number of respondents, with 18 reporting instances. ENGL 102 had the second largest number of reporting instances, with 10.
