#	Questions	Responses
1.	What is coronavirus?	A <u>coronavirus</u> is one of a number of viruses that cause diseases in mammals and birds. In humans, the viruses cause respiratory infections.
2.	What is the coronavirus in the news?	According to the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> (CDC), a coronavirus – initially referred to as 2019 Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) – is a virus identified as the cause of an outbreak of respiratory illness first detected in Wuhan, China.
3.	What is COVID-19?	COVID-19 is the name given by the WHO to the new coronavirus. It replaces "2019 Novel Coronavirus and 2019-nCoV." The word coronavirus refers to the group of viruses it belongs to, rather than this latest strain.
4.	How does coronavirus spread?	When person-to-person spread has occurred with viruses similar to coronavirus, it is thought to have happened mainly via respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. Please see <u>How COVID-19 Spreads</u> for additional information.
5.	What are the symptoms of coronavirus?	The <u>Pennsylvania Department of Health</u> has information about the coronavirus available <u>here</u> , including a listing of symptoms: Runny nose
